"This is a sad Christmas, a Christmas of war. There are people starving. Please have a big heart and do not spend as if nothing is happening." He noted that there are children playing with pieces of Russian missiles, as they go hungry while other people starve. Speaking initally about Ukraine, Pope Francis noted that we are living a third world war fought piecemeal, saying that although Ukraine feels closer, there has been a terrible war in Syria for 13 years, as well as in Myanmar and "everywhere in Africa". "The world is at war," he said.
