Croagh Patrick - Reek Sunday – 28 July: Reek Sunday falls on 28 July, when thousands of pilgrims are expected to scale Croagh Patrick (2,510ft/765m), Ireland's Holy Mountain, to pray and participate on the summit in the Sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession), and of the Eucharist. Pope Francis has designated 2024 as a Year of Prayer, and this year's pilgrimage theme is: 'To pray for and honour grandparents and the elderly' #ElderlyandGrandparents. 7:30am until 2:00pm, Confessions will be heard on the summit. 8:00am First hourly Mass on the summit. 2:00pm Last Mass on the summit.

Pope's Schedule for Apostolic Journey to Asia and Oceania

Departing from Rome on 2 September, Pope Francis will first make his way to Indonesia, landing in the capital, Jakarta. Then, on 6 September, he will travel to Port Moresby to greet the faithful of the Pacific island nation of Papua New Guinea, where he will remain until 9 September. From there he will fly to Dili, the capital city of Timore Leste. Then, from Dili, Pope Francis will travel to Singapore for the final leg of his journey, from 11 to 13 of September, on which day he will return home, back to Rome.
