





#### Have you time for silence in your life? Have you time to Pray?

"The great aim of the monastic life for Benedict was as simple as it was demanding: the aim was to pray constantly, in the general sense of keeping the memory of God alive in your heart at every moment of the day and night. As with anyone we love, we enjoy thinking about them and catch ourselves turning towards them spontaneously at odd moments. Another way of expressing this is to say that the purpose of the monastic life is purity of heart, that purity of heart which enables us to see God in everything and hence to be aware of 'you' at all times. As the prophet Jeremiah says: 'You, O Lord, are in the midst of us and we are called by your name.' Monastic life aims to remind us constantly

**Pope Francis** launched an appeal on Sunday as he prayed the Angelus with pilgrims in St. Peter's Square. Speaking after the traditional Marian prayer, the Holy Father recalled the anniversary of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki at the end of the Second World War. He asks us to pray, **"Let us renew our intense prayer for peace, especially in martyred Ukraine, the Middle East, Palestine, Israel, Sudan, and Myanmar."** He invited everyone to pray for **"victims of those events and of all wars".**
