Mass commemorating those who have died in the past 12 months will be celebrated on Sunday 3rd November at 9.30 a.m. in Rahugh and 11 a.m. in Kilbeggan. Families are invited to

come along and remember prayerfully, loved ones who have gone to their eternal reward. During the month of November there will be a place for families to leave the names of the dead in the sanctuary – they will be remembered at Masses during the month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls.

With this Final Document, we have gathered the fruits of at least three years in which we have been listening to the People of God in order better to understand how to be a “synodal Church” – it is by listening to the Holy Spirit – at this time.



The Document we have voted on is a threefold gift: Firstly, for me, as Bishop of Rome, in convening the Church of God in Synod, I was aware that I needed all of you: Bishops and witnesses of the synodal journey. Thank you!

There are highly concrete indications in the Document that can be a guide for the mission of the Churches, in their specific continents and contexts. This is why I am making it immediately available to everyone, it is the reason I said that it should be published. In this way, I wish to recognize the value of the synodal journey accomplished, which by means of this Document I hand over to the holy faithful people of God. The Document is a gift to all the faithful people of God, by the variety of its expressions. It is obvious that not everyone will set out to read it. It will largely fall to you, together with many others, to make what it contains accessible in the local Churches. The text, without the witness of lived experience, would lose much of its value.

Dear brothers and sisters, what we have experienced is a gift that we cannot keep to ourselves. The impetus that comes from this experience, of which the Document is a reflection, gives us the courage to witness that it is possible to walk together in diversity, without condemning each other. Remember – that “there are places in which the Spirit breathes, but there is only one Spirit who breathes in all places”.
